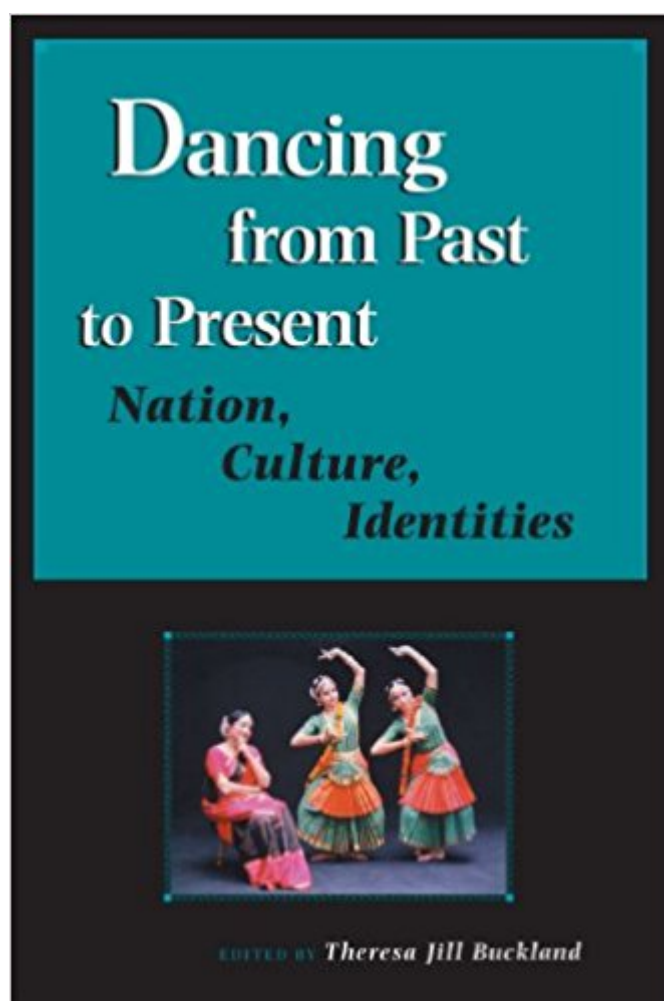


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Dancing From Past To Present: Nation, Culture, Identities (Studies In Dance History)
