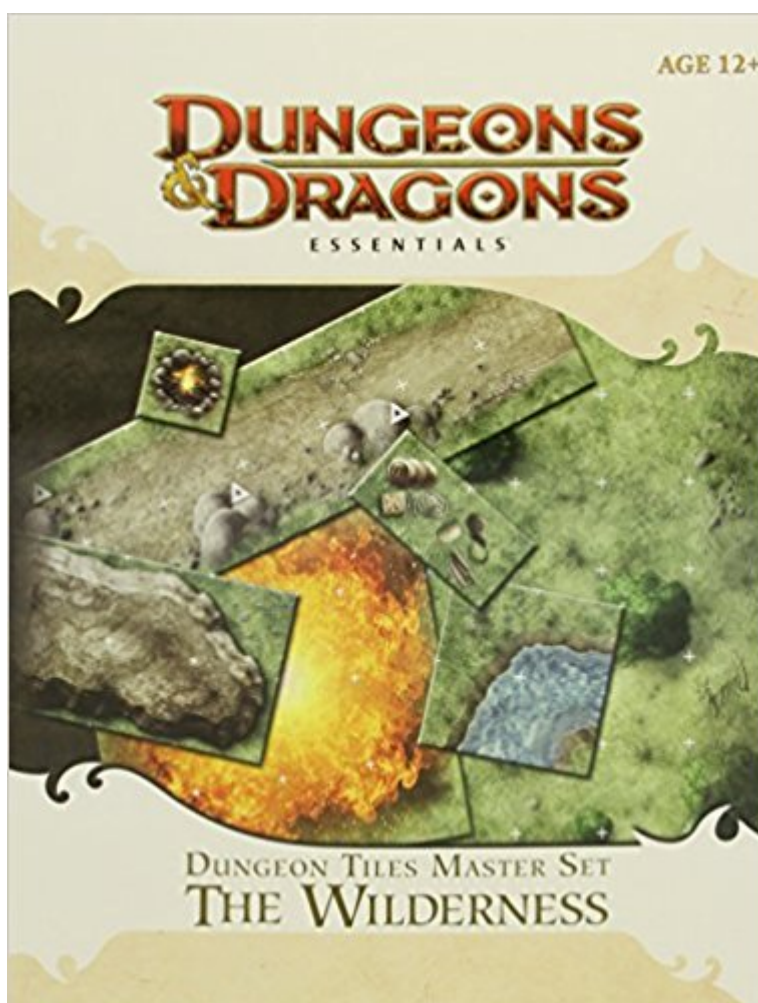


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Dungeon Tiles Master Set - The Wilderness: An Essential Dungeons & Dragons Accessory (4th Edition D&D)

before this I hated running any RPG campaign dealing with towns because it kills the momentum and just becomes 2 hours of haggling for magic items. This helps open up story ideas and plot hooks.

I was not a huge 4th Edition D&D game fan when it came out. That confession done, Wizards of the Coast and Hasbro have won me over with their fantastic gaming props. The entire set of essential tiles are fantastic! The quality is top-notch. The tiles are two-sided, and each of the sets contains

numerous add-ons that allow nearly endless varieties of terrain for encounters. Since all of the tiles are done with symetric, equal squares for the grid, everyone of the sets is geomorphic. You can use the wilderness set with the city set to create a park in a city. You can use the dungeon set with the wilderness set to create a gothic, evil clearing. The only limit is your imagination. Truth be told, I use this tile set with all of my fantasy role-playing table-top games. For the price, it would be hard to imagine a better deal. Well done Hasbro! In service, Rich[...]

I ordered this as a "what the heck" buy, since I've never had tiles before, I wasn't sure if I wanted to dive into them and the price was irresistible. This tile set is an amazing set for the price (I got it for just over \$12!). The tiles are extremely well printed on very heavy card stock (2mm thick). Just poring over them and looking at the details has got me thinking about how I can use them. Others here have given excellent descriptions as to what you're getting, so I'm not going to repeat them and my set came exactly as all the others described. I am very pleased with what I got. So far I'm having fun just playing around with layouts!

Very nice tiles. Would be nice to have some instructions or examples on how to use them.

Being a DM, I find I need places to store my stuff (tiles, maps, tokens, ect) and these Essential boxes fit the bill nicely. With the City box, you get a variety of tiles that you can use in a urban environment, buildings, roofs, markets, ect. There are certain things I would have like to have seen, like more variety in things that players might interact with while in a town and different type of towns from small hamlets to large metropolitan areas. But this box certainly gives you the basics to get started with and you also get a nice storage box to keep them in. All-in-all, certainly 4 stars.

This wilderness set is perfect if you're looking to order new tile sets and not sure which on to get. 1. It comes in a box that also has images on it- so I use it to hold all my tiles plus it can be used as tiles (a 3D cliff effect) 2. You can combine it with Sinister Woods set and other ones to make a huge outdoor area. 3. Comes with rivers, ponds, paths, cabin, trees, trenches, "Stone Hedge" tile, etc. The only downfalls I see with this are that it doesn't come with enough paths and river pieces to make them turn and bend. Also, I think that there is too many fire pieces (I would have preferred different forest-y elements). It's still a must-have. You won't be disappointed.

I love D&D tile sets. Just can't get enough of them. PROS: Good, solid tiles as expected. Decent

variation. Tiles are useful. CONS: Not enough streets, too many sewer tiles, the tiles for the shops are wanting. And it just seems like the scale is a bit small...just off. I would have like more rooftop options and definitely more roads and outside object tiles. Even with 2 of these sets it does not cut it enough to get me to 4 stars. It's the "almost set" for me.

This is really a good set, the quality of the graphics are very good and it's very versatile for the 2 settings available. Generally one side has the outdoor city areas and the other side has underground sewer areas. Note that the front of the box shows roof tops, there are no tiles with the roofs on them, only the box they come in has that so don't expect any real use from those. The value here is mostly with the street tiles, the sewer tiles and the added items like shop kiosks, carts, etc. There are a few tiles that are limiting, like a cut out of indoor areas that only work well with each other and wouldn't really go with anything from the other sets. Otherwise every tile will get use in my games.-D

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
