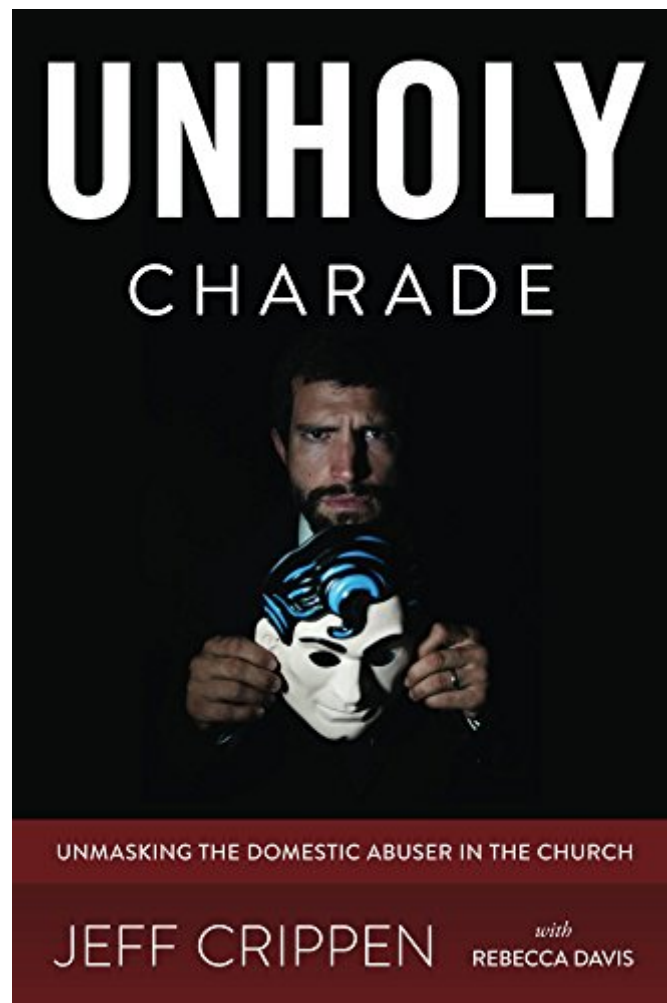




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Unholy Charade: Unmasking The Domestic Abuser In The Church

I found Pastor Crippen's first book shortly after I separated from my now ex-husband almost 3 years ago. I had been married for 16 years to an verbally abusive sex addict. The first book gave me such closure from 16 years worth of unanswered questions, it was literally like a balm for a gaping wound. I often refer to his first book when I have questions in my life about my ex. But...this book -- Wow. I bought it a few days before what would have been my 18th wedding anniversary and waited to read it on that very day. I read it in one sitting, along with a highlighter that I literally used up highlighting verses and wisdom. This book saved me from another day, another hour, another moment of despair.
