

The T3i/600D is my first DSLR camera and I know nothing about photography past point-and-shoot. I feel this book is perfectly written for both beginners and intermediate users. The book was written in very plain English and got me up and running within 30 minutes. The author gives just enough details to understand the difference between features without using too many tech terms that might have scared me off. The picture illustrations could have held my hand a little better but they are more than adequate for identification of key components. It has now been three days and I am already able to use all the basic features of my camera and am ready to move on to more extensive practice. This book gets straight to the point and I guarantee your experience will be similar to mine. A definite must buy for NEWbs.

This manual is compact enough that you can take it with you on your outdoor photo shoots. Tons of excellent information right at your finger tips. The index markings on the side of the pages makes it fast and easy to get to the subject you are looking for. Buy this and carry it with you... you won't be sorry.

It is what it is. It's basically a rehash of the basic manual but easier to read and understand with better illustration etc. I'm glad I bought it but the "compact" description is a bit misleading. It's actually a bit larger than the manual that comes with the camera but not huge or anything. I was kind of expecting more of a pocket version I guess. I did not pay to much attention to the specs before ordering. My fault and no big deal but just do not expect something that will fit in your shirt pocket. I'm goinng to look for something more like a 1 page double sided laminated cheat sheet to go along with this book.

There are several things I look for in a field guide, such as ease of use, quick means of finding things, durability, and accuracy. This guide rates high in all those things. You can lay the guide down, opened to the page you need, and use both hands to push the buttons on the camera. The colored tabs at the edges of the pages make finding the information you need easy. The pages and cover are tough enough to get pushed around in your camera bag. So far, I have found no errors in the information, and there is plenty of information for me to use. I have other books by the same author, and I like them all. This one is always in my camera bag to make up for my dwindling memory. Highly recommended.

Why can't cameras or other devices come with this kind of simple, colorful guidebook? This is exactly what I was hoping it would be, with simple, direct instructions, well illustrated and with answers to any questions I might have as I get used to this new high-tech camera. As for the Canon, it takes the best pictures the most effortlessly of any camera I have ever used. I had a fine Minolta SLR for 25 years and it took a lot more work than these spiffy new digital cameras! In truth, as long as you master a few buttons, this Canon will take superb pictures at the push of a single button! But I wanted and needed a good guidebook and this is it, folks!

Having purchased a Canon 3ti last summer, I was naturally eager to start learning about it. I initially bought another book, and while it was good I decided I wanted another opinion. David Busch definitely knows what he is doing, and his Compact Field Guide is great! It takes up very little space in my bag with my camera, and is full of great information. This guide, in addition to David Busch's full sized manual (which I received for Christmas, and totally recommend) gives me a wealth of information on my new camera. I couldn't be more pleased.I would definitely recommend this to a friend.

I bought and read David's big manual for the T3i for my Kindle then bought this in paper to carry in my camera bag and have found both to be very useful. I don't carry this in my bag much as I don't like the extra weight and I travel light but I do find it a really good quick reference with an excellent table of contents and index to find basic information fast.

I bought this to help me understand my new T3. I placed it on my iPad for field work but I was worried about having the illustrations not match up with the writing. Fortunately the two usually are on the same page so your not having to turn to many pages to see what is being written. The information can be too basic but for complete newby's too much information can be good for them to learn the capabilities of their new camera.

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
