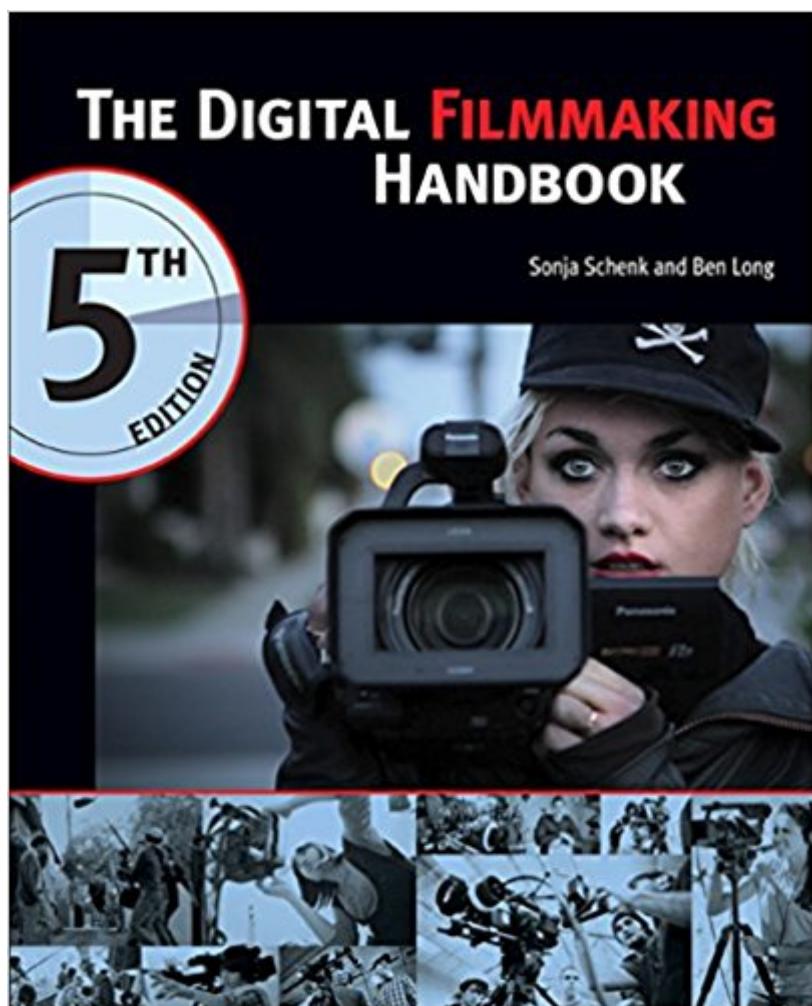


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# The Digital Filmmaking Handbook, 5th Edition

This book is OK but definitely not a resource handbook for filmmakers. Much of the material is outdated. Also keep in mind that even though a book has a 2015 copyright, it was probably written a year or two prior. And it takes time up to a year for the publishing process. Because it fails to go into depth on any of the subjects, it is geared towards people with little experience or knowledge. If just getting into video this could be helpful. Wastes to much time on obvious concepts. Very wordy and uses BIG type. This 530 page book is really only a few hundred pages if a typical size font were chosen. Photo quality could be a LOT better. I would think that someone in the industry would be able to provide high resolution photos. Plus any color photos are lumped together in one section and you have to try and search for them while reading. A beginner's book.
