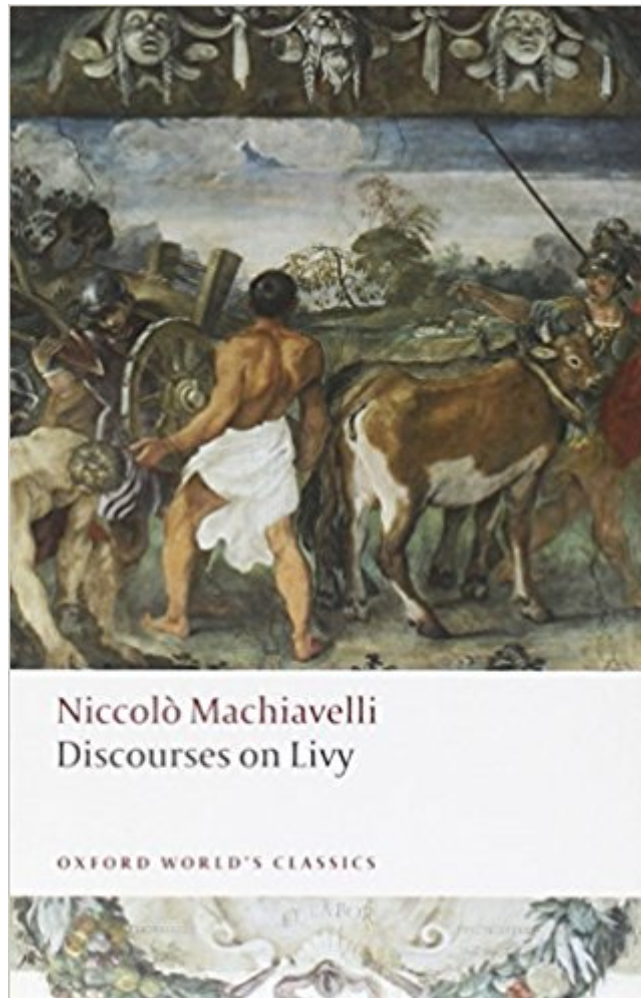


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Discourses On Livy (Oxford World's Classics)



Synopsis

Discourses on Livy, written in 1531, is as essential to an understanding of Machiavelli as his famous treatise, The Prince. Equally controversial, it reveals his fundamental preference for a republican state. Comparing the practice of the ancient Romans with that of his contemporaries provided Machiavelli with a consistent point of view in all his works. Machiavelli's close analysis of Livy's history of Rome led him to advance his most original and outspoken view of politics--the belief that a healthy political body was characterized by social friction and conflict rather than by rigid stability. His discussion of conspiracies in Discourses on Livy is one of the most sophisticated treatments of archetypal political upheaval ever written. In an age of increasing political absolutism, Machiavelli's theories became a dangerous ideology. This new translation is richly annotated, providing the contemporary reader with sufficient historical, linguistic, and political information to understand and interpret the revolutionary affirmations Machiavelli made, based on the historical evidence he found in Livy.

Fantastic. What a gem. The translation is excellent, easy to read, easy to follow. Sentences and thoughts they carry flow seamlessly. There is nothing prosaic about this book. As for the content, it is edifying. The name Machiavelli carries a stigma. We all know that and we can trace the origins of this undeserved label with very little effort on the internet, it is omnipresent. Looking through the shroud of negative propaganda we can discover a modern intellectual genius, *Il Principe* is "the founder of modern political science" *Il Principe*. I use the word *Il Principe* loosely since he died in 1527. I read Livy's *Il Principe* "The Early History of Rome" before I read *Il Principe* "Discourses on Livy" so my opinion about this book might be different from someone who has not read Livy. To me, it is like seeing a movie after reading the book the movie was based on. The wealth of background information makes reading *Il Principe* "Discourses" that much more interesting. And it is a very interesting read. Political yes, but Machiavelli's decorous arguments and reasoning based on examples from ancient history engage the reader in an insatiable desire to read more.

Thoughtful and helpful Introduction, excellent Notes, and the husband-and-wife scholars who are the team translators did a subtle and, to an amateur, undetectable job of rendering period idioms into proper but more comprehensible language. It deserves its place in the Oxford World Classics series.

The Oxford World's Classics edition of Machiavelli's Discourses is a scholarly yet accessible translation, with useful notes on Machiavelli's sources and citations. The book itself is every bit as essential for an education in modern political thought as the Prince is. The work is in the same style,

but longer and more (pardon the pun) discursive than the Prince is, but anyone who found the shorter work interesting will find the Discourses rewarding, and each of Machiavelli's two great political works adds further dimensions to the other: they are best read together.

Machiavelli makes observations of what is to him ancient and contemporary events to analyze them and the reader will find many things that pertain today and will have a better understanding of what drives events.

If you want to understand what went wrong, or what should have been done instead, read this. It is also entertaining - humorous at times
