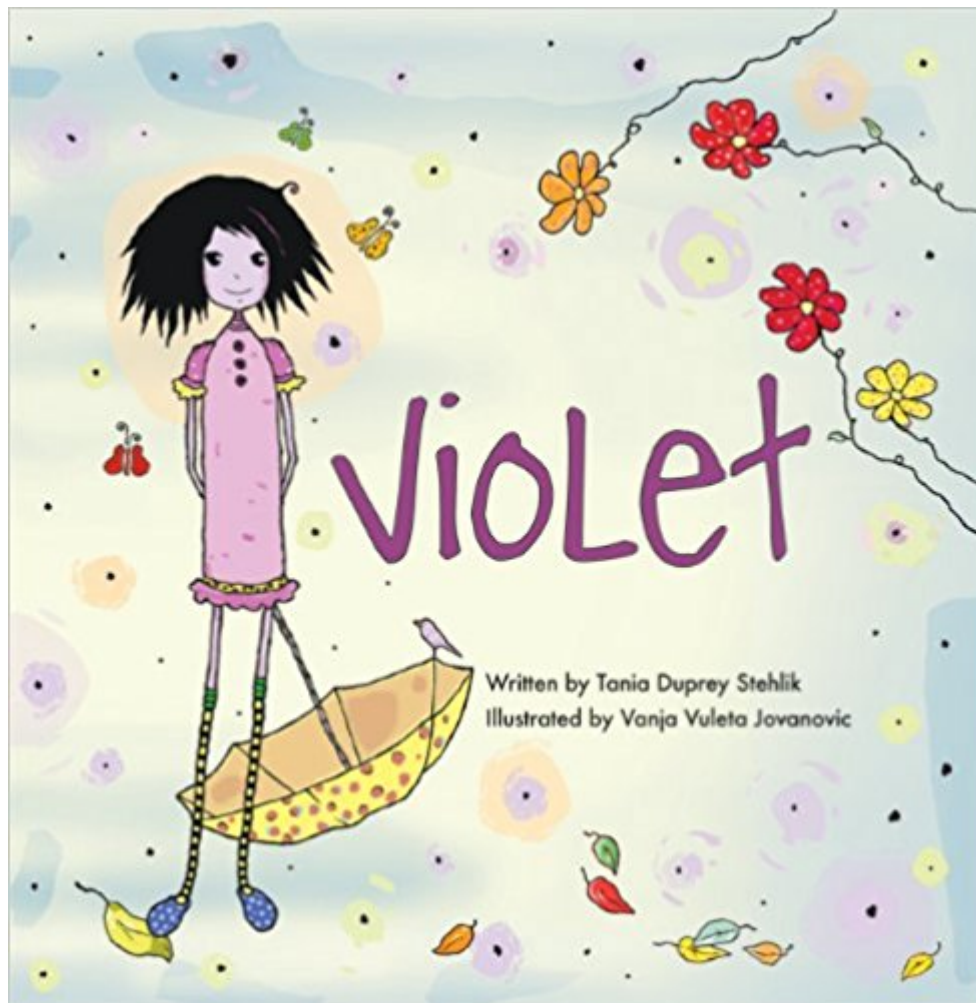

I ordered 6 different books to help my bi-racial daughter understand why her skin tone is different from most the kids at school and different even from her parents. This was by far the best of the six for a young child.

My three-year-old has started to have a lot of questions about why her family looks different than most. This book does a wonderful job opening up that conversation in a way that a young child can understand. Plus, the illustrations are beautiful which my little creative girl loves.
