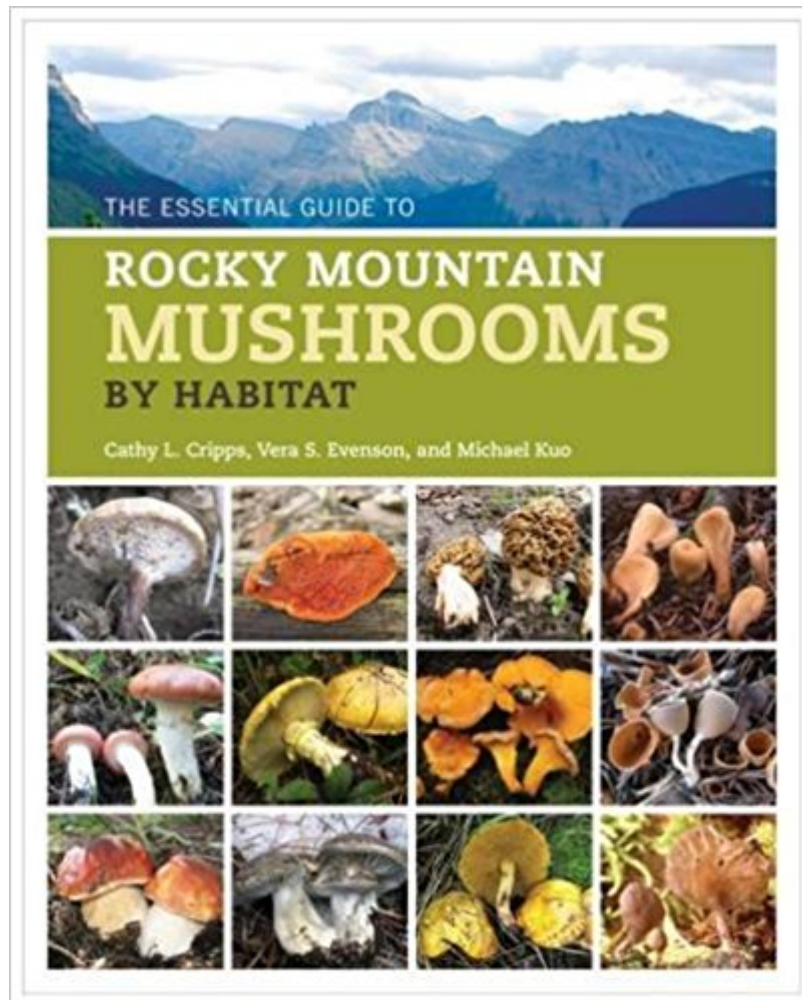




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The Essential Guide To Rocky Mountain Mushrooms By Habitat

An eco-centric approach to the search for fungi

This is one of two excellent mushroom guide books for the Rocky Mountain Region and in my case, Colorado. The only other field guide that comes close is the book titled "Mushrooms of the Rocky Mountain Region: Timber Press Field Guide (A Timber Press Field Guide)", which is also authored by Vera S. Evenson from the Denver Botanical Gardens. In my opinion the two are complimentary guides and the best i have found for our region.*This books main strength lies in the fact that it is arranged *BY HABITAT*. For those of us who are new to mushroom hunting this is the best one for me as i can pick habitat areas to forage in for the mushrooms i am looking for. Excellent guide, can't recommend a better book, except for maybe the other one i mentioned above already. This is a wonderful book, by one of our very best western mycologists and teachers, Dr. Cathy Cripps. It is full of first hand knowledge of the intricate natural communities found throughout the Rocky Mountain area, and the fungi that intertwine and connect with all of life within those communities. Only the most visually prominent and interesting of the fungi found in each unique habitat (prairies, aspen groves, snowmelt, fir forests, etc.) are described, along with its companion plants and animals. If there has been rain in the Rockies, and you go to the described habitat, you will find many of these fungi! This is far from a mushroom cookbook or a mere focus on edible mushrooms, but a wonderful guide to how fungi play an important role in all of these many marvelously described mountain communities. I can't wait to bring this book along with me when I travel again to the SW and S. CO this summer. Telluride Mushroom Festival goers: buy this book! It will deepen your appreciation for those always dramatic, mushroom-filled landscapes, and it is

lightweight enough to carry in your backpack.
