


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Mel Bay Concierto Antillano: Score For Guitar And Orchestra



Synopsis

This concerto for guitar and orchestra was composed by Ernesto Cordero, one of Puerto Rico's outstanding contemporary composers. The pastoral first movement portrays the idyllic Antillean landscape using a combination of continental Spanish and Antillean Spanish Creole influences, which are most discernible in the lush, romantic cadenza. The second movement is distinguished by the alternation of two melodies: one, a melody blending a number of ancient influences, and the second distinctly Cuban in nature. This movement was inspired by the peaceful summer calm of the Antillean seas. The third movement is the only one in the work to draw directly on Puerto Rican folklore, quoting a fragment of the seis milonga, a traditional dance. This excerpt is united in this movement with its familiar Argentinean counterpart. The last movement is the most challenging movement of the three for the guitar soloist, demanding a nearly virtuosic performance. The full score calls for flute, oboe, clarinet in B-flat, bassoon, horn in F, trumpet in B-flat, timpani, and strings in addition to the guitar soloist. One of Puerto Rico's outstanding composers, Ernesto Cordero received his musical training both in Puerto Rico and from the "Real Conservatorio de Música" in Madrid, Spain. He later studied composition in New York with Julian Orbán and in Italy with Roberto Caggiano. Presently,

Maestro Cordero continues his duties as Professor of Composition and Guitar at the University of Puerto Rico, a position he has held since 1971. His total compositional output is printed by some of the world's most respected publishing houses including: Max Eschig (France), BÃƒÂ©rben (Italy), Chanterelle Verlag and Hubertus Nogatz (Germany) and Mel Bay Publications, Inc. (USA). Cordero's compositions are performed and recorded around the world by many of today's leading artists.
