

I purchased this book as a supplement to other texts that I was using for my vet school anatomy courses. This book has some of the most beautiful and well-thought-out anatomical plates that I

have seen in veterinary anatomy. However, the book is seriously deficient in content--for example, only the major muscles, bones, blood vessels, etc., are labeled--and would not be suitable as a standalone text for any high-level veterinary course. I do not understand why the Veterinary Information Network would give it such rave reviews. This book would be useful for an undergraduate-level animal anatomy survey course. It is still worth the purchase if you are interested in anatomy from an aesthetic and overview perspective.

I bought this as an artist studying comparative anatomy. If you already have a grounding in human anatomy it can be quite helpful but there are no front, rear, or dorsal views of muscles and skeletons so it can be difficult to tell where muscle insertions and origins are. So while this book is not very comprehensive I haven't found a better one yet.
