


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# A Catechism Of Modernism

The Rev. Father J. B. Lemius, O.M.I., was a priest and author of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. His Catechism of Modernism, founded on Pope St. Pius X's encyclical *Pascendi Dominici Gregis*, attempts to break down and organize the various beliefs of the modernists. Father Lemius' work was praised by Pope Pius X, along with an added hope of a wide circulation. It was originally published in the early 1900s by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, New York, and subsequently reprinted by TAN in 1981.

I am fairly new to Modernism and its errors so more than few terms and explanations in this book seem foreign to me but other than that it is very revealing

This book is dense at times sometimes awkwardly organized. Despite its flaws (which are very minor), I highly recommend that anyone who wants to understand the foundation (of sand) that is the current church in its hierarchy, you must read this book. How did we get to a time when it seems like the majority of the bishops, cardinals, and even recent popes are against traditional Catholic practice and orthodox teacher? This is not a new thing to affect the church. The Arians had their bishops, just like the modernists do today. But we have the truth. This book has a peculiar structure: being an original work dating from 1907, it is based on the encyclical "Pascendi Dominici Gregis" (On Modernism) from the authorship of Pope Saint Pius X and, more than a catechism, it is written as an imaginary interview conceded by that Pope himself to the author Rev. J. B. Lemius, where the first one dissects meticulously and magistrally, as only he knew, the modernist heresy in all its branches. That book in its time was highly praised by Saint Pius X, and it is actually an essential tool to all the Catholics understand how far the modernist heresy penetrated inside the Church, very especially since the Second Vatican Council.
