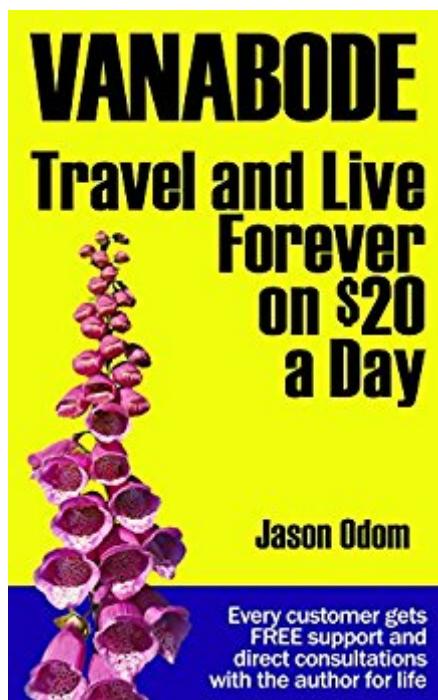


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# Vanabode Happily Camp, Travel And Live Forever On \$20 A Day

Starts off slow, very sloooow that almost makes you feel like you're listening to an infomercial with repetitive promises without helpful substance. But if you hang in there or bypass the first handful of chapters, at long last the remaining 80 percent is chock full of useful suggestions and tips. Don't be taken back by some of the authors questionable lowball cheapskate antics (like slipping into a sales

presentation to chow down on appetizers and drinks in Las Vegas, etc. Provided you can overlook judging the author, you'll find numerous practical tips well worth your time investment.

I purchased this book on my Kindle after reading the reviews, even the poor ones. As an avid reader and not just someone hunting for information I very much enjoyed the book. I particularly like the philosophical aspects of it blended in with the more technical information on vanaboding. Some of the poor reviews complain about the fact that you could find a lot of this information for free on the internet, but who wants to do that? Why spend hours scouring the internet when the information you seek is in one convenient place? I think the links for free camping and such are worth the purchase price alone. The only complaint I would have is that I do wish there had been a more thorough budget showing how to stay at \$20 a day per person. Much of it can be inferred, but a budget spreadsheet would have been really nice. All in all I found the book extremely helpful, informative, and inspirational.

You can not go wrong with buying and reading Vanabode! I bought this book and read through all of it with my fiance. Jason Odom has almost a million miles of van/road travel alone. Always loved the saying "You don't learn how to make \$1,000,000 a year from someone who makes 50k, 100k, or even 750k a year. You learn from someone who makes \$1,000,000 a year." I have been driving since I was 16 am now 21 and haven't even driven 100,000 miles total. It's crazy to think that the author of Vanabode has driven almost a million miles in vanabode travel alone. This guy knows what he's talkin' about. If you are serious about vanaboding, I highly recommend this book.

The book has two aspects of living in a van. One is to try to convince you that it is an objectively superior way of living compared to having a job and buying a house. The other part is the actual details of how to successfully live in a van. For the first part, I was not convinced that living in a van is better than my current arrangement of working a job and living in a house. There is a bit of straw man in the reasons against home ownership and working, with only the worst aspects mentioned. The bigger issue, though, was reading the details of how to live in a van. Odom was very thorough on that, and because of this I'm giving the book four stars, even if I don't want to adopt the Vanabode lifestyle. He explains how to find a place to park the van when you sleep, how to deal with going to the bathroom, doing laundry, cooking, etc. If you want to live this way the book will give you a great start. Unfortunately, I like having indoor plumbing too much and working around that is worse than working for me. If you like the experience you get living the vanabode way, though, that

won't matter.

I've found no better book about how to start the RV lifestyle now, simply, on the cheap. The awesome thing about this book is that it describes a step-by-step plan to make the lifestyle work. Bob Wells' book is more thorough, and describes more options, but I would never have read Wells if I had not read Odom first. \$20/day is possible, but not outrageously comfortable. Also, it does not seem to include long distance travel, depreciation on the vehicle, or repairs. It's also true that Odom recommends a carefully-selected, used, almost unmodified older vehicle, which reduces costs.

I really enjoyed reading this book! I enjoy reading and researching ways to be free from society norm. Jason Odom gave some good ideas of travelling tips via a regular customised cargo van. I have for years been planning how to economically travel across the USA without spending a lot of money and not having to rent or purchase an expensive RV. And Jason nails it for me in this book!

What an inspiration! He's thought of everything... this book validates that we all have choices, and yes we can choose to live an authentic life. Jason's book examines every possible barrier / excuse one could conjure up and provides a solution for each. For anyone who ever questioned the (in)sanity of living the "American dream", this is the book for you...A "counter cultural way of life" guide book. Or simply great ideas for ways to travel on the cheap !!
