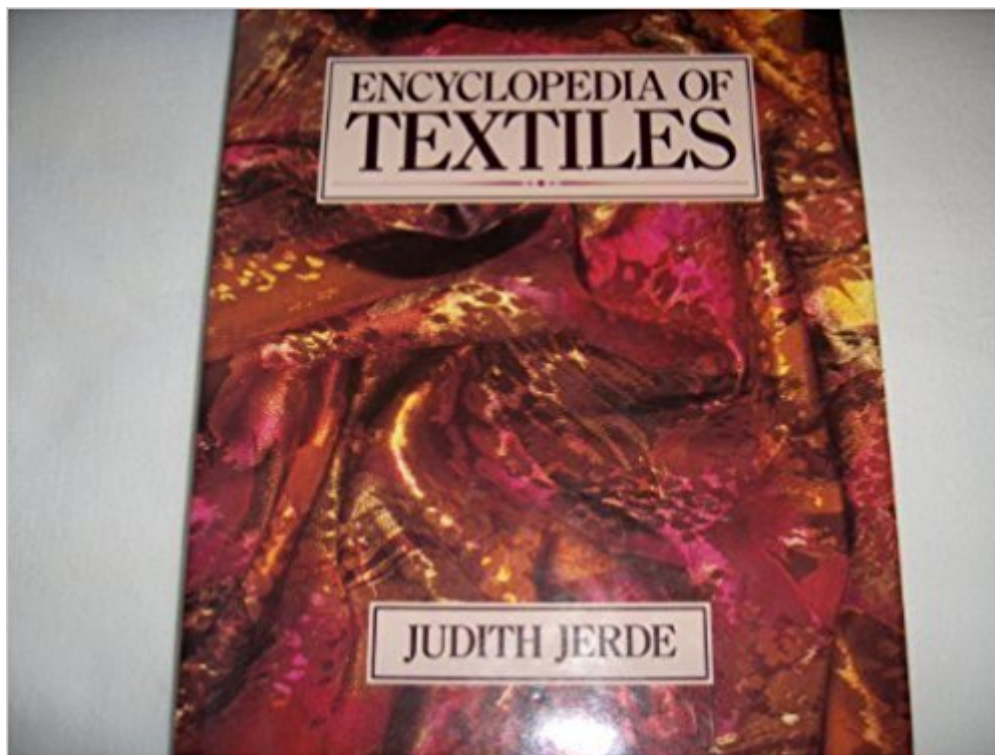


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# Encyclopedia Of Textiles



## Synopsis

Spanning nearly 5000 years of textile history, this book covers the field from the first practical and decorative use of fabrics to the introduction of modern synthetic materials. Organized in an A to Z format, the work provides information on fabric, fabrication methods, machine processes (felting, weaving) and more. At the same time, the book also covers methods of producing and treating fabrics, such as block printing, calendering and delustering. Biographies of major textile and fabric innovators are also included.

The author's extensive background in costume and commercial textiles is evident in this one-volume encyclopedia written for the general reader. Entries emphasize manufactured as opposed to handcrafted textiles and include information on fabric types, natural and manufactured fibers, manufacturing processes, finishes, surface design, and dyeing. There are also brief biographical sketches of individuals notable in textile history. The volume is illustrated throughout with line drawings and photographs.
