

I bought this for my five year old and she loves it, but it is a little complex...she colored it for the most part, but I did help. If your child cannot color in the lines yet, or doesn't understand color contrast, then this is not the book for you. I would recommend this for older children (8+). However, I LOVE

this book because it gave me the perfect supplement to our "My Body" unit that we started a few months ago. Each page became a launching point for talking about anatomy and physiology...two subjects my daughter is fascinated by.

Very disappointing. It's not a book, it's just a thin booklet. No colorful illustrations, it's all black and white, supposedly for coloring by the kids. In reality, my 7 year old son (who is very interested, and asked to get a book on the human body), tossed it away after 12 seconds. His younger brother (5 yr old) also wasn't interested. They would not even consider coloring it. I insisted on sitting and reading it together, and found it was not clear, stimulating or fun. My son didn't learn much. For us, it was a waste of time and effort, I'll look for better books out there.

This would probably be okay for older kids, but too detailed for early elementary. The info given on each page is also too vague.

This book is ok. A lot of the pages were still stuck together and had to be ripped apart.

Purchased this as part of our homeschool curriculum and my first grader loves it.

I'm not sure how I misread that, but it's a coloring book and it's awesome! I need to find more books like this. Very entertaining! Bought it for a homeschooling lesson and kindergartener loves it!

I am using this book with 9-12 grade special needs students. I like the details and close-ups of the various body systems. I also like that this is a coloring book. They will have fun discovering all of the fascinating systems of the human body. I have also shared it with a fellow teacher who works with the deaf and hard of hearing. Thanks!
